her work has been featured in numerous publications, including *Education Week*, *The New York Times*, and *The Washington Post*.

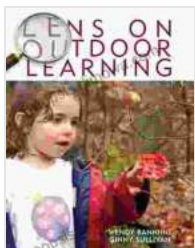
Banning is also the author of *The Outdoor Classroom Handbook* and *Nature Play: A Guide for Parents and Educators*.

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
