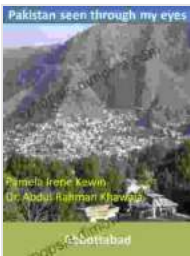


Pakistan Seen Through My Eyes: Abbottabad In Pictures

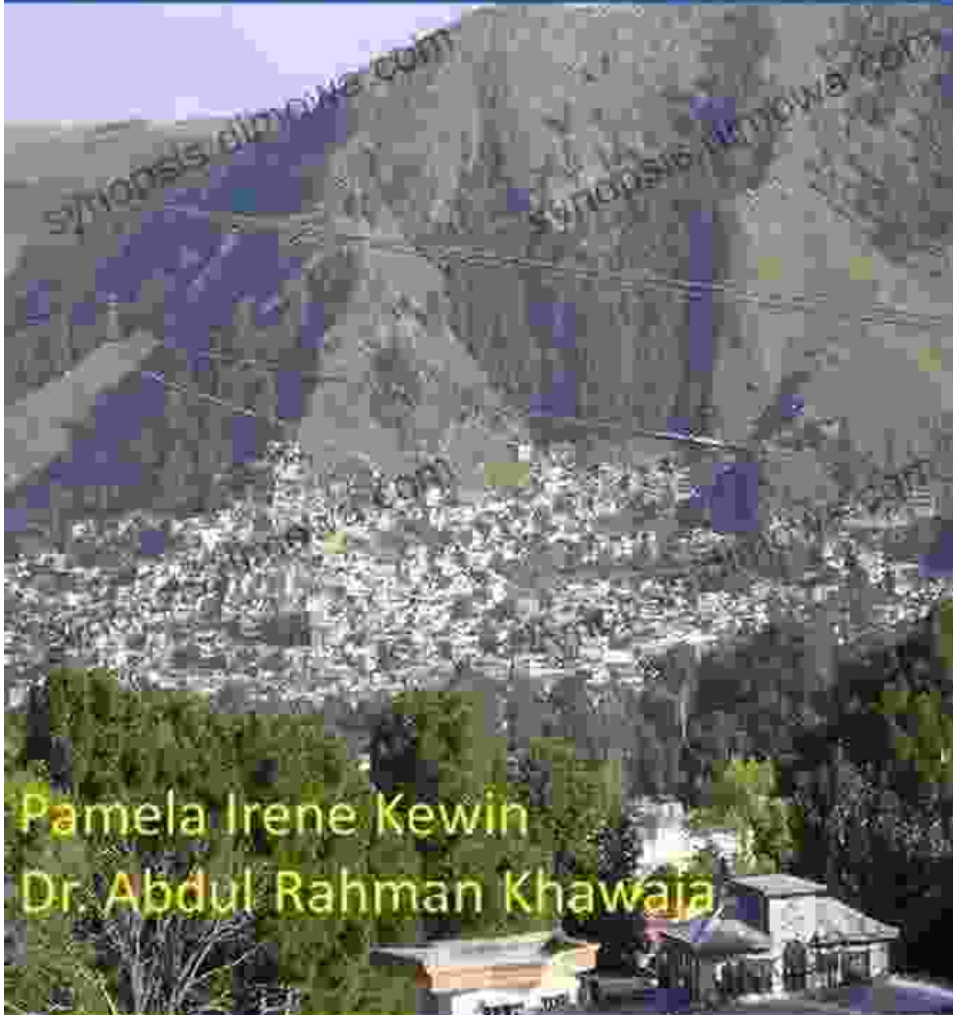
